

**Instructions to Contributors**

The Journal of the Bombay Ophthalmologists' Association publishes four issues in a year. It accepts original articles, rare case reports and short reviews. All the articles are subject to editorial revision.

1. All the papers should be accompanied by a statement that they have not been published in any other journal or presented in any conference and that, if accepted they will not be offered to any other publisher/conference without the consent of the Editorial Board. All the authors should sign in this statement.
2. For the articles (papers) already published earlier elsewhere, written permission of the relevant authority should accompany the article.
3. 3 copies of the article (paper) must be sent.
4. The matter must be typewritten in double space on bond paper with adequate margin. Alternatively the paper can be sent in electronic form as a word 2000 or word 97 document on a floppy or by e-mail to [boa@vsnl.com](mailto:boa@vsnl.com). Tables and diagrams may be embedded within the document but photographs must be sent as separate jpeg files.
5. The title along with the author's name, address of the institution, and reprint request must be typed in a separate page.
6. The manuscript in the case of scientific papers must be in the following format: Title, Abstract & Keywords, Introduction, Material and Methods, Results, Discussions, and References. The abstract must be short, conveying the aim, method of study, result and conclusions.
7. Tables should be typed on separate pages and numbered, titled with suitable column headings.
8. Photographs should be submitted in quarter size (3 1/4" X 4 1/2") on glossy paper. Indication of top and figure number should be shown at the back of the

photograph. Title of the article may be written at the back of the photograph. If submitted in electronic form the photographs must be scanned in at 600 dpi and then sent as jpeg files in CMYK format, on floppy or by e-mail.

9. Colour photographs shall be published at the author's cost (Film scanning charges, extra printing charges, etc). This amount must be paid in advance.
10. All contributions will be accepted for publication only after review by two members of the editorial board.

Reference: In accordance with the Vancouver agreement the Journal of the Bombay Ophthalmologists' Association has adopted standard bibliographic patterns as follows:

A paper or book cited in the text is referred to by a superscript in numerical order, in which it is first cited in the text not in alphabetical order by the author's name. For convenience in preparing the typescript, the reference number may be typed between parentheses on the line, not superscript. The titles of the journal will be abbreviated in accordance with the style of the Index Medicus. In the typescript they could either be abbreviated in that style or given in full. Authors submitting papers are requested to adopt it in order to facilitate editing.

Reprints: 3 prints will be supplied free of charge to the author. More copies, if required, will be supplied at extra cost. This requirement must be mentioned while submitting the article.
